Using Tech

Many of our assignments will require the use of the internet and Google apps (Classroom, Drive, Docs, Slides).

Remember to follow school policies for technology. A Chromebook will be checked out to each student. Please charge every day and bring to class.

Cell phones are to be placed in the organizer at the front of the room. Occasionally we may use them for an assignment.

Headphones/earbuds might be necessary but are not to be worn unless prior approval is obtained.

Classroom Procedures

Arriving/Leaving:

- Please take care of business BEFORE the bell rings.
- Upon entering the classroom, sit down and begin bell work.
- You must have a HALL PASS to leave the classroom.
- Complete the LOG SHEET for exiting and entering.
- At the end of class, remain seated until I dismiss you.

Daily Work and Homework

You will have daily bell work that covers vocabulary, grammar, literary terms, writing, and more. This will be done in your composition notebook. In addition, you will participate in daily reading, listening, speaking, and writing activities. Most assignments will be done in class as I try hard to limit homework. Most homework assignments will be assignments we were unable to finish in class. You will be expected to read your SSR book and complete long-term projects outside of class.

Academic Honesty

Any student caught cheating or plagiarizing will receive a zero on that assignment/test/quiz and will be referred to the office if necessary.

Assignment Formatting

All major assignments will use MLA formatting:

- Running header in the upper right corner with last name and page #
- Heading on the left of the first page with name, my name, class, date
- Centered title
- 1" margins
- Double-spaced
- Size 11 or 12 normal font
- No extra spaces between sentences, paragraphs
- No excessive bolding, italicizing.

S.S.R.(Silent Sustained Reading)

1. During our in-class silent reading time, you may read books that you haven't read before. School assignments do not count.
2. Even if you complete your book talk, you must read during SSR.
3. I expect the books to be appropriate for your age and reading ability.
4. Get your book from any source. Talk to me about using electronic devices to read. iPods, iPads, and cell phones will not be allowed.
5. Quarter book talks will count as a test grade. To receive the full 50 points, you must successfully report on 250 pages per quarter. It is the total number of pages, not the number of books that will determine your grade. If you read more than the required number of pages, the extra will carry over to the next grading period.
6. Books with pictures (e.g. *Diary of a Wimpy Kid*) will count less. Come see me to discuss a reasonable page count.
7. Reading takes place in class, but students will need to read outside of class.
8. The book report is an informal "book talk" with me. Your job is to convince me that you read the book. Be prepared to answer specific, detailed questions about your book.

S.S.R. Continued

10. Feel free to complete book talks early!
11. Book talks are due the end of the quarter and I will schedule times.
12. You are allowed ONE book talk a day.
13. You must have your book with you when you report.
14. I will keep track of your pages.
15. You may report on ONE movie/tv related book a year to a maximum of 150 pages total.
